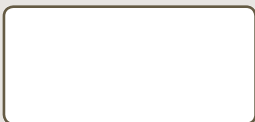

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Stamp the Mini Country Snowflake in black. Use the StampRight™ placement line to determine the position of the image. Rotate the stamp between impressions. Clean the stamps each time before re-inking them with a new color. Leave enough space for subsequent images.
2. Stamp the Mini Country Snowflake again in cardinal and again in lime.
3. Stamp the Tiny Ornament in cardinal and again in black.
4. Stamp the Tiny Bell in pinecone.
5. Stamp the Tiny Tree in green tea.
6. Stamp the Mini Antler Right in pinecone.
7. Stamp the Mini Antler Left in pinecone.
